
Altogether a very successful athletics day.

S.T.E.M. Specialist Training



WNPS has just been notified that the application placed at the end of 2017 was successful. This is great news as the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) training will enable our school to drive further improvement in the teaching and learning of Mathematics across the school over the next two years. The government is providing significant funding for STEM (approximately \$24.7 million over four years) as 21st century skills and attitudes are required for our children in their lives. These skills and attitudes include problem solving, preserving, designing, digital skills and reasoning skills.

In the Australian Curriculum, students become literate as they develop the knowledge and skills to interpret and use language confidently for learning and communicating in and out of school and for participating effectively in society. Literacy involves students in listening to, reading, viewing, speaking, writing and creating oral, print, visual and digital texts, and using and modifying language for different purposes in a range of contexts.

The Melbourne Declaration on Educational Goals for Young Australians (MCEETYA 2008) recognises literacy as an essential skill for students in becoming successful learners and as a foundation for success in all learning areas.

The Literacy continuum incorporates two overarching processes:

- · Comprehending texts through listening, reading, and viewing
- · Composing texts through speaking, writing and creating

With the following areas of knowledge applying to both processes:

- Text knowledge
- Grammar knowledge
- Visual knowledge

In a 'nutshell' Literacy is the ability to speak, listen, read and write.

School Supplies 2018

Included in this newsletter are the details of the school costs for 2018.

Statements will be posted out to all families at the beginning of 2018 with payment due as soon as possible. Families wishing to pay in two instalments should pay the first instalment by the end of February and the second instalment by the end of Term Two.

Payment can be made in person at the school office, by sending the payment in a named envelope with your child or online using internet banking. Our bank details are: BSB 313-140 ACCOUNT NO. 12012190.

Families who are in receipt of a Centrelink payment (e.g. Family Tax Benefit, Parenting Payment, etc) are able to set up a Centrepay facility to pay their school account in fortnightly instalments. Please call at the school office for further information or to set up Centrepay.

WARRAGUL NORTH PRIMARY SCHOOL SCHOOL COSTS 2018:

The school charges for the 2018 year as set by School Council are as follows:

STUDENT SUPPLIES \$195.00 (PER STUDENT FOUNDATION) \$185.00 (PER STUDENT YEARS 1 - 6)

To ensure all WNPS students have the stationery supplies needed for the academic year the Warragul North School Council makes a bulk purchase from reputable suppliers on behalf of parents. This



ensures parents are able to purchase their child's supplies very cost effectively and easily. The bulk purchase also means all students have the same supplies (e.g. pencils, pens, rulers, paper, paint, glue, etc). This cost also includes materials and equipment for Visual Arts, Performing Arts and Physical Education. On the school account statement that parents receive the student supplies are charged as 'Essential Education Items' as per the Department of Education guidelines.

MATHS ONLINE \$20.00 (PER STUDENT FOUNDATION - YEAR 6)

Maths Online is an educational website catering for Kindergarten through to Year 12. Maths Online enables children to use tutorials to learn and revise a large range of topics. It has a comprehensive Australian K - 12 curriculum with 1,411 animated and narrated mathematics lessons, a bank of tests and instant feedback to students. Once payment has been made a personal password is issued allowing access 24 hours, seven days a week.

WUSHKA ONLINE \$20.00 (PER STUDENT FOUNDATION - YEAR 6)

Wushka is an online levelled school reading program which helps students learn to read and includes an extensive selection of fiction and non-fiction levelled school readers. Every levelled reader has an online comprehension quiz and printable teacher support material. Teachers manage their own class, easily setting class reading levels, reading groups and choosing readers to read at home. Once payment has been made a personal password is issued allowing access 24 hours, seven days a week.

HEADPHONES \$20.00 (PER STUDENT FOUNDATION - YEAR 6)

For use in classrooms with laptops, i-Pads, i-Pods and audio equipment. Students will use the headphones during Digital Technology lessons. Headphones are to be retained from year to year.



MEMORY STICK \$20.00 (PER STUDENT YEARS 3 - 6)

For use at school and home to enable students to store their school work. These are supplied with a Warragul North Primary School lanyard. Memory sticks are to be retained from year to year.

GROUNDS MAINTENANCE CHARGE \$35.00 (PER FAMILY)

Parents are keen to see the school's buildings and grounds properly maintained in order to provide their children with a clean, tidy and safe learning environment. To assist in achieving this goal payment of the grounds maintenance charge will allow the school to engage paid labour.



WORKING BEE \$60.00 (PER FAMILY)

The Buildings and Grounds sub-committee of School Council hold a minimum of two working bees each year. At Warragul North Primary School we recognise that parents cannot always be available on these days. The working bee charge enables families to contribute in lieu of attendance.

'FOR THE RECORD' SCHOOL YEARBOOK \$30.00 (PER FAMILY)

The school yearbook is issued at the end of the year to the eldest child in each family. It is a fantastic record of the Warragul North Primary School year and includes photos of the many activities the children take part in during the year such as concerts, production, camps and excursions.



Hello from the Acorn Room



Over the years I've developed this concept I like to refer to as 'the buffer'. There are so many tasks to be completed, obligations to meet, activities to get involved with, and opportunities to make the most of... 'The buffer' is the gap between all these things we take on, and our actual full time capacity. We

read about how children are being 'over scheduled' and don't' get enough time to just play, and how time poor we all are. Perhaps we have taken on too many 'good' commitments. It's hard to say no in the face of all the good opportunities for our children, all the good opportunities for us! But if we lose our 'buffer', we may miss the value of it all. Your 'buffer' might look like being able to drink your cup of tea while it is still hot. It may be being able to be 'mentally present' as your child tells their (sometimes long winded!) story from their day at school. It might be feeling relaxed and not rushing kids through the bedtime routine. Having a 'buffer' in your schedule may mean you have the capacity to respond and help when a friend is in crisis without that sending your own world into crisis. Have you lost your 'buffer'? What do you need to do to get it back? There

may be some tough decisions to make about letting go of commitments or saying no. My hope is that by getting back your 'buffer' you may better be able to enjoy the richness life has to offer. And your whole family will benefit.

OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE

At the start of the school year children in Foundation grades were taken to their rooms after Before School Care and collected from their rooms for After School Care. For the past two weeks these children have confidently found their own way to and from their classrooms and are well settled in to the OSHC program. The sandpit is a popular place for imaginative play at After School Care sessions. Children of all ages play well in groups building roads and mountains and making tunnels. The playgrounds also have plenty of scope for obstacle course races and various games.

OSHC is available on a permanent or casual basis. Some sessions are fully booked and a waiting list is held for those sessions. Please remember that the Office or OSHC must be notified if your child is not going to attend a session they have been booked in for.

That place can then be used for a casual booking. Once you have a permanent booking you will be billed for that placement whether your child attends or not.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.




Dear Parents,

Keeping Kids Hydrated

While the weather is warm, it is important to ensure your children are drinking enough fluids.

Children need ~ 1.5Litres of water per day. On warm days, or, on days when kids have undertaken physical activity kids may need over 2 litres.

The best hydrating fluid for children is water.

Tips for keeping kids hydrated in the warmer months: Pack a water bottle in your child's lunch box each day Freeze the drink bottle the night before and place it in the lunch box for a cool drink throughout the day Juice based icy poles
