# WuShka Learning to Read

Wushka is an online levelled school reading program which helps students develop reading skills and includes an extensive selection of fiction and non-fiction levelled school readers. Every levelled reader has an online comprehension quiz and printable teacher support material. It is very pleasing that of the 620 students currently enrolled at Warragul North Primary School, 458 have had Wushka paid for them.

Once payment of \$20 has been made a personal password is issued allowing access 24 hours, seven days a week. This is a great program for students to have, especially with the holidays upon us as they can use it at home.

We are now using Wushka's cloud-based levelled reading program at school and would love you to continue reading with your child at home. The program encourages students to engage with fiction and non-fiction texts on interactive devices. All School Readers are levelled from Level 1 through to Level 31+ and have been developed using decades of educational publishing experience.

Recognising that the best outcomes are achieved when students continue reading at home, the Wushka School Readers are now available after school hours. The program is individually tailored by your child's classroom teacher and allows readers to be set for homework.

# Hello from the Acorn Room



Parenting is one of the most rewarding, challenging, and amazing things you'll ever do. But sometimes, it doesn't feel like much fun. The children might be fighting, ignoring you, not doing what they're asked, and being emotionally demanding or even distant. Although the love is still there, parenting when the wheels have fallen off, does not feel good.

It's common for families to go through periods when things seem to flow, and periods when they don't. Perhaps you can think back to a time when you put into place some helpful structures and routines for the family. It may have gone smoothly initially, but then the motivation to keep up with the new routines or to be consistent with following through faded. Maybe a bit of fatigue and discouragement has settled in. This is normal.

It's ok to take a breather. Look around at your family – What seems to be going on? What's changed? What have you stopped doing? What changes might be helpful here? It's ok to stop, reflect, and decide it's time to do a reset. Talk about the changes and why they need to take place. And be sure to keep demonstrating warmth in your love.

### NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM LITERACY AND NUMERACY (NAPLAN)



Will my child sit NAPLAN on paper or online?

In 2019,

your child will sit the NAPLAN online tests. However, children in some other schools across Australia will sit the NAPLAN paper tests this year. Federal, state and territory education ministers have agreed that all schools will move online by 2010.

As students are assessed on the same literacy and numeracy curriculum content, regardless of whether they complete the test online or on paper, results for both formats can be reported on the same NAPLAN assessment scale. To find out more about NAPLAN Online visit nap.edu.au



Please be aware that the 'reserved' parking permit area near the administration building is for staff use only and permits must be displayed on the windscreen.


If everyone adheres to the agreed parking areas and

### SEARCH:

Click the 'Search' icon and type **Warragul North Primary School** into the search bar. Select Warragul North Primary School from the results.

### ADD:

Add the boxes that apply to you i.e. your child's grade. When the box changes from 'add' to 'remove' you are connected. Likewise if you would like to remove a grade select the remove box.

### **INBOX:**

Click on the Home icon. This is where you will receive instant messages from FlexiBuzz.

### **REMEMBER:**

At the beginning of each school year you need to login to FlexiBuzz to reselect you child's new grade.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### **HOW TO APPLY**


New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
