Student achievement involves the combination of a number of elements in the learning process such as setting goals, understanding the learning intent, thinking, developing skills, feedback, reflecting and exerting effort to achieve. Each student needs to understand that they are the learner and that they are responsible for their own learning.

Teachers can support students to continuously refine and improve their learning and understanding. Teachers can assist students to set learning goals and understand learning intentions. Teachers can then use evidence (what the student can do, say, make or write) to provide feedback and assist students to evaluate their progress, that is their achievements. Teachers can support students to reflect on their learning and the impact of effort on achievement.

Learning requires students to engage in a thinking process and exert effort to achieve. Students striving for excellence can achieve to their potential. Achievement requires effort by learners as they engage in the learning process.

In a 'nutshell' Achievement means accomplishing your learning goals using effort and skill.

# Hello from the Acorn Room



During this term, I have been meeting with a small group of Year Five and Six students, working through a program called Seasons for Growth. Seasons for Growth is a grief and loss education program designed especially for kids. Children's experience of grief is an issue close to my heart, having experienced a number of significant

bereavements in my own family in recent years and having primary school aged children myself. The Seasons for Growth program uses the metaphor of the seasons to help children work through their feelings about changes in their own families.



Some helpful understandings are:

- Change and loss are a normal part of life
- The experience of loss and grief is unique for each child, but almost all children will experience some sadness, anxiety, anger, resentment, confusion, guilt and loyalty tensions
- The feelings and other reactions children feel as a result of significant change and loss in their lives are normal
- We can all learn new skills to assist with adapting to change and loss

I have been tremendously privileged to work alongside this particular group of students. I've been impressed by the courage with which they have shared, and by the way they show care for each other. The experience of grief is a journey. Being able to share some of the load helps. We hope to offer more opportunities for students to participate in Seasons for Growth in 2020.

# School Costs 2020

The school costs for 2020 were confirmed at the October meeting of School Council.

Statements will be posted out to all families at the beginning of 2020 with payment due as soon as possible. Families wishing to pay in two instalments should pay the first instalment by the end of Term One and the second instalment by the end of Term Two.

Payment can be made in person at the school office, by sending the payment in a named envelope with your child or online using internet banking. Our bank details are: BSB 313-140 ACCOUNT NO. 12012190.

Families who are in receipt of a Centrelink payment (e.g. Family Tax Benefit, Parenting Payment, etc) are able to set up a Centrepay facility to pay their school account in fortnightly instalments. Please call at the school office for further information or to set up Centrepay.

### WARRAGUL NORTH PRIMARY SCHOOL SCHOOL COSTS 2020:

The school charges for the 2020 year as set by School Council are as follows:

#### **STUDENT SUPPLIES** \$250.00 FOR FOUNDATION STUDENTS \$240.00 FOR YEAR 1 - 6 STUDENTS



To ensure all WNPS students have the stationery supplies needed for the academic year the Warragul North School Council makes a bulk purchase from reputable suppliers on behalf of parents. This ensures parents are able to purchase their child's supplies very cost effectively and easily. The bulk purchase also means all students have the same supplies (e.g. pencils, pens, rulers, paper, paint, glue, etc).

This cost also includes materials and equipment for Visual Arts, Performing Arts and Physical Education. On the school account statement that parents receive the student supplies are charged as 'Essential Education Items' as per the Department of Education guidelines. Foundation students receive a WNPS satchel, a whiteboard and a set of headphones.

Included in the student supplies cost are Maths Online and Wushka. These are educational websites for Mathematics and reading that the children will use at school and will also have access to at home.



#### 'FOR THE RECORD' SCHOOL YEARBOOK \$30.00 PER FAMILY

The school yearbook is issued at the end of the year to the eldest child in each family. It is a fantastic record of the Warragul North Primary School year and includes photos of the many activities the children take part in during the year such as concerts, production, camps, excursions and incursions.




